The world famous Unicorn Tapestries that hang in The Cloisters took 3 weavers almost 15 years to make.

The 14th C. masterpiece, 'The Annunciation' by Robert Campin lives in The Cloisters on loan from The Metropolitan Museum of Art.





The Cloisters keep the interior lighting dim to protect the valuable artwork and to enhance the museum guests' experience as they move from interior spaces to the stunning medieval gardens.

Medieval gardens were often planted in quadrants which looked like a cross from above.
