













# At the Field Museum of Natural History, Sue the T-Rex comes along once every million years or so.





There are over 30 million historical artifacts stored at the museum.

Sue is the largest fossilized Tyrannosaurus Rex on display in the world. Paleontologists estimate that she was around 28 years old when she died.



The skeleton of Sue shows many broken bones and large skeletal holes that may have been caused by a serious bone infection.



The much larger Titanosaur taking Sue's place in the Great Hall is 125' long. That's almost 3 times longer than Sue!
