At New York's Metropolitan Museum of Art, see the Temple of Dendur and learn the story of Hatshepsut the most powerful female king who was almost written out of history.



The United States raised almost \$16 million in the 1960's (today, that equals \$250 million) to rescue Egyptian temples from rising waters from the Aswan Dam project.

Hatshepsut was the first woman ever elevated to the station of King of Egypt, around 1900 B.C.



Later Egyptian rulers believed that acknowledging a female King would create an imbalance in the universe so they sought to erase her from history by destroying all of her statuary images.
