The Charles W. Morgan was originally built in just 9 months in 1841. More than 20 million visitors have walked the decks since her arrival in Mystic, CT.





All of the buildings in the 19th Century seafaring village are authentic. See many of the maritime trades such as woodcarving, ship building, barrel making, rope making, and more!
