Question 1

More Talking Points:

- 2. Why is uranium such a challenging element to work with?

Question 2

What do you think about when you hear "nuclear science"?

More Talking Points:

- 1. What were you most surprised to learn about nuclear science?
- 2. Do you think the original researchers would be shocked at what new technology has been developed as a result of their efforts?

Question 3

Why was Los Alamos, NM chosen as the location for early nuclear research? More Talking Points:

- If you were working on a top secret project, where would you want to be located?
- 2. What do you think family life was like for the scientists of uestion 4

Where were the other 'secret cities' located in the United Staes? Why were they secret?

More Talking Points:

- 1. Why were multiple cities necessary for the Manhattan Project research?
- 2. Why were these cities ideal locations for the project?

What would it have been like to work on the Manhattan Project in complete secrecy?

- More Talking Points: What materials were used in the laboratories to keep employees safe?
- 2. Do you think the employees understood the importance of this project?

- Question 8

More Talking Points:

- 1. When did the race to develop nuclear capabilites begin?
- 2. Do you think having nuclear capabilites helps keep our country safe?

Question 9

Can you explain the term 'Broken Arrow'?

More Talking Points:

- 1. What precautions were taken to ensure there were few accidents?
- Although a bomb was accidentally dropped on the outskirts of Albuequerque, it was not radioactive. Why?

Question 10

Nuclear technology is used in many areas of modern life. Can you name a few?

More Talking Points:

- 1. What are some of the results of advancements in nuclear medicine?
- How has nuclear energy been used to power entire cities?
