- Where do you think many American animators might live? Why?

Question 3

More Talking Points:

- How would you feel if your original work were destroyed?
- 2. How does the work survive despite the loss of the original artwork?

Question 4

When did the popularity of comic strips begin?

More Talking Points:

- 1. What comic strips are you familiar with?
- 2. Which are your favorites? Why?

Question 5

How did Beetle Bailey come to be?

More Talking Points:

- What additional comic strip originated with the Beetle Baily strip?
- What additional confict strip originated with the beette bailty stCan you think of any TV shows that evolved in a similar way?

More Talking Points:

Why do you think showing emotions could be challenging?
 Why is showing emotions in characters so important?

Question 10

What is the difference between 2D animation and 3D animation?

More Talking Points:

Why has the industry shifted to 3D animation in recent years?

What do you think the next generation of animators will be producing?
