Question 1

Question 2

The award-winning Wild Walk offers a birds eye view of the treetops. Why was this so important in the planning process?

More Talking Points:

- Why does the bird feeding station area have a sign that says. 'Air Traffic'?
- 2. What can you see from the treetops that you might not see on the ground?

Question 3

How are even dead trees important in nature?

More Talking Points:

- Are dead trees still full of life? What can you find in them?
 - 2. How do they continue to support life in the forest?

Question 4

Spiders produce their webs from materials 'manufactured' in their own bodies. How do these materials differ in how they are used?

More Talking Points:

- How do they help the spiders survive?
 The oversized spider web gives visitors a chance to experience.
- a spider web in a totally new way. Why is this so special?

Question 5

Many years ago the Wild Center land was a working farm. It has eventually returned to it's natural state. What does that tell you about nature?

More Talking Points:

- 1. Why do you think it was important for the government to let the land return to its natural state?
- 2. Have you ever seen land return to it's natural state over time? Where?
