The early Kermit puppet on view at the museum in the Jim Henson Muppets exhibit is only the second Kermit ever made. This was before Kermit got his trademark **collar and flipper feet**.

Fan magazines first appeared in 1911. They featured the actors, their personalities, good looks and glamorous lifestyles. Gone by the 1960s, they were replaced by Us Weekly, People and InStyle magazines.

Makeup artists in the film industry **create magic** with the help of prosthetics after making a cast of an actor's face.

Some of the materials used are foam latex, gelatin, silicone or other similar materials.

See how easy it is to create your own fun and wacky sock puppets!

Materials Needed:

- 2 colorful socks
- Pre-made curly ribbon bows
- 2 pair of eyes (available at craft stores)
- Colored pompoms
- Low Temp glue gun

Step 1 Put hand in sock to create puppet shape. Push in toe area to create mouth.

Step 2 Glue eyeballs, and pompom nose into place.

Step 3 Glue curly ribbon into place at heel of sock which is now the top of the puppet head.

Step 4 Make a friend for your new sock puppet!

Now create your own puppet show!

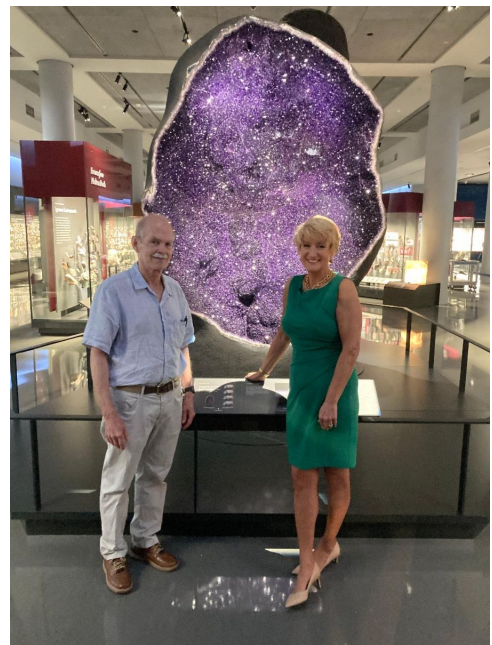
