










We travel the world of museum collections in this special episode "Best of World History" with stops in **Egypt, China and Italy.**

The Terracotta Warriors

guarded the first emperor of China's tomb for centuries until one of the figures was accidentally discovered by a farmer in 1974. The underground 'pits' are believed to hold more than 8,000 soldiers, 130 chariots with horses, 150 additional cavalry horses and more.

Make Music with your own "da Vinci" Water Xylophone!

Materials Needed:

- Glass Bottles with caps
- Food coloring
- Wooden Spoon



Step 1 Fill each of the glass bottles with different levels of clear water.

Step 2 Add a different color of food coloring to each of the bottles. A few drops should do. Add more drops for a deeper color.

Step 3 Line the bottles up and you're ready to make music

by tapping the side of the bottles with your spoon.

Xtra Tip

For a louder sound, try using a metal spoon. Better warn Mom first!
