













The Neue Galerie and Museum is a

jewel-box of a museum housed in a restored Beaux-Arts mansion

located on the museum mile of New York City.



The Neue Galerie and Museum building was designed by the architectural firm of Carrere & Hastings in 1914 as a private residence.

Ronald Lauder and Serge Sabarsky purchased the building and converted it into a museum which **opened in 2001.**

The decorative art collection at the Neue includes pieces from the important Viennese workshop of Wiener Werkstatte, considered to be a

pioneer of modern design

at the time.
