there are millions of fossils under one roof at the La Brea Tar Pits Museum,  
and they are still excavating more every day!

## Did Ya KNOW?

The La Brea Tar Pits is the only fossil site in the world that's being actively excavated in the middle of a modern city.



Sixteen new fossil deposits were discovered during construction of a nearby underground garage.

The deposits were transferred into 23 large wooden crates for further excavation, hence the name 'Project 23'.

ZED the Columbian mammoth was a rare discovery since his skeleton was 80% complete and included his skull and both of his 10 foot long tusks.

### Dinosaur Bones

Measure ¼ cup flour  
¼ cup salt  
¼ cup water

Mix the flour and salt in a bowl.  
Add water and mix.  
Knead the dough.

Shape into bone shapes.  
Bake in 250 degree oven for 2 hrs.  
Once cooled, hide them in your yard and have your friends 'excavate' them!
